Thank you for your interest in the 2021 Coastal Ocean Science Academy (COSA) at Northeastern University's Marine Science Center (MSC).

Located on historic and picturesque East Point, Nahant, the MSC's outreach program has been serving students of all ages for over a decade. This year, COSA will engage students in hands-on research, investigation and exploration of local threats to coastal and marine environments. There will be opportunities to meet professionals engaged in marine-related careers and to explore the diversity of New England's coastal habitats.

Program Duration

The program runs from Monday, August 16 through Friday, August 20, 2021. The hours are 8:30am–3:30pm.

Due Dates

Spaces are filled on first-come, first-served basis, and group sizes and spots are limited this year due to COVID protocols. Applications are now being accepted for the 2021 program, and participants will be accepted on a rolling basis until all slots are filled. Scholarship applications are due by July 16th.

Fees

The program fee for 2021 is \$545 for the one-week program. Residents of Nahant are eligible for a 50% reduction in fees. The program fee includes all instruction, field equipment, transportation to offsite field locations, and a 2021 COSA t-shirt. Packaged lunch and snacks will be provided.

Program Information

There are two programs offered simultaneously the week of Aug 16-20 (see below). Most of the time, the two groups will be working separately, although we build in time for both groups to work together, and for returning *Pagurus* students to work with and mentor *Chondrus* students. All students will have the opportunity to hear from and interact with academic researchers at the MSC and partner institutions. Program assignment is based on whether or not this is the student's first time in the program and/or previous similar programs.

ቾ COSA Chondrus

For first-time participants. The *Chondrus* program provides an introduction to marine science in local ecosystems. Students will gain knowledge of coastal and marine habitats, including ecological and physical characteristics. They will develop skills such as identification and classification of marine organisms, monitoring water quality, measuring species richness and diversity, and analyzing survey results. They will also begin to explore threats facing coastal and marine ecosystems. Students will work in small groups to prepare and present a research question to the group. Maximum group size is 10.

ቾ COSA Pagurus

For students who have previously completed the *COSA Chondrus* program or an equivalent marine science programming. This is a more rigorous research-based experience where students build on knowledge learned in *COSA Chondrus. COSA Pagurus* students will deepen their knowledge of local marine ecosystems. Emphasis is placed on student-led field investigation, and the experience will also include a lab portion. Pagurus students may have the opportunity to mentor *Chondrus* students in field studies. Participants will have access to field sites for data collection and guidance from staff and research scientists in developing sound research questions, methodologies, analyzing data, and presenting results both in the field and in the lab. Maximum group size is 5.

Food

Packaged lunch and snacks will be provided.

Health Protocols

In compliance with Northeastern University and regional COVID protocols and event regulations, we are implementing the following protocols (these are subject to change following updated recommendations, and any changes will be communicated to participants before the start of the program):

1. participants are required to have a negative COVID test completed within 72 hours of the start of the week's programming OR have been fully vaccinated

- 2. COSA staff, instructors, and guest speakers are all fully vaccinated
- 3. group sizes are reduced to enable distancing during program
- 4. masks will be required during indoor activities

Transportation

The program takes place at Northeastern University's Nahant Campus at 430 Nahant Road, Nahant, MA 01908, and participants should be dropped off by 8:30 am at the check-in table inside the entrance gate to the MSC, and picked up at 3:30 pm each day. Unfortunately, we are unsure at this time if we will be able to provide transportation to Nahant as in past years, due to COVID protocols - we will update this space if there are any changes, but at this time, participants would need to be dropped off directly in Nahant.

Payments & Refund Policy

The program fee for 2021 is \$545 for the one-week program. Residents of Nahant are eligible for a 50% reduction in fees. The program fee includes all instruction, field equipment, transportation to offsite field locations, and a 2021 COSA t-shirt. Packaged lunch and snacks will be provided.

A full refund of the deposit is possible before the July 16th. After that, a full refund of deposit and/or additional payments will <u>only</u> be made if we are able to fill the student's spot. If we are unable to fill the spot before the first day of the program, no refund will be made.

No refund will be given if a student is dismissed from the program due to failure or inability to meet the program expectations guidelines (see *Student Behavior/Expectations* below).

Scholarships

Thanks to the support of generous donors, we are pleased to offer a limited number of full and partial scholarships to students interested in participating in the program. Our program goals are aligned with national efforts to create and foster diversity in the pursuit of academic and career opportunities related to STEM (Science Technology Engineering and Math).

Preference will be given to students who are eligible for free/reduced lunch or whose family meets the income eligibility levels based on federal guidelines [http://tinyurl.com/ja3924e]. A limited number of full scholarships will be offered to students eligible for free or reduced lunch. If funds permit, partial scholarships may be awarded to other students expressing need. Those interested in applying for a scholarship must indicate their interest on the registration form below and submit the letter of recommendation. No additional scholarship application/documentation is required.

Arrival/Departure Times

Drop participants off at 8:30am at the MSC, and pick up is at 3:30pm at the MSC. Unfortunately we are unsure at this time if we will be able to provide transportation to Nahant as in past years, due to COVID protocols - we will update this space if there are any changes, but at this time, participants would need to be dropped off directly in Nahant.

What to Bring

- Layers of clothing, a change of clothing, and/or rain gear is highly recommended. The temperature in Nahant may differ from other communities, and it is often windy on the coast.
- Feet will get wet at some point or another, so closed-toed and high-traction-soled shoes such as boots, water shoes, or old sneakers are required for field work. Tevas, slip-on sandals, flip flops, Crocs, and heels are not allowed while we are in the field, but are acceptable while we are working in the classroom.
- A hat is advisable.
- A change of clothes may be stored onsite during the program in case participants get very wet.
- Participants may bring their own sunscreen and/or bug repellent from home.
- Each participant should bring a reusable water bottle.
- Each participant should bring their own lunch and snacks.

Transportation to and from Activities

COSA staff will escort students at all times when moving between activities. COSA students are transported to nearby field sites in passenger vans driven by staff who are authorized and trained to drive University vehicles. A detailed agenda, including program schedule, topics, and travel logistics, will be shared prior to the program.

Absences/Late Arrival

Many activities happen in the field and are time-dependent, so the group may not be able to wait for a student who is running late. All parents and students will receive staff contact cell numbers in advance of the program.

Please keep the staff aware of any changes in students' schedules. If a student is not coming to the program due to illness or other reasons, please inform the staff by 7:30am.

Staffing and Instruction

Lead program staff members are experienced STEM educators trained in classroom and field-based teaching and learning of marine science. Programs will be staffed with a minimum of 1 instructor per student 5 students. Material and skills covered are relevant to the Massachusetts Framework for Science and Technology and the national Next Generation Science Standards.

Program Status

The COSA program is not a camp under 105 CMR: 430.800, and, thus does not have staff medical personnel on staff. COSA instructors are not permitted to carry or administer student medications. Efforts are made to provide reasonable accommodations for students with disabilities (see Section below entitled "Accommodations for Students with Disabilities").

Student Behavior/Expectations

COSA is an academically rigorous program and, in addition to field study outdoors, students should be prepared for activities including classroom instruction, data collection, and oral/discussion analysis. On a daily basis, students may walk up to a mile at a time to access beaches, rocky shoreline, and marshes, and spend 2-3 hours at a stretch conducting fieldwork in the elements (direct sun, rain, wind). COSA staff provide group and one-on-one support during all activities, but students should be prepared to work both as part of a peer team and independently in field and classroom settings.

Although students may wade in shallow water to collect field samples, there is no swimming allowed during the program. Weapons of any kind, drugs, alcohol, and smoking products of any kind are not permitted. Cell phone use is not permitted during program activities, with the exception of emergencies, or in the case that instructors allow cell phone use for specific project related activities. Disruptive, dangerous, or disrespectful behavior will result in dismissal from the COSA program. Students unable or unwilling to comply with any expectation listed above <u>may be dismissed</u> from the program. There are no refunds for a student dismissal.

We aim to serve the diverse needs and learning styles of all students, and gathering information about these needs before the program will help us make COSA a successful and enjoyable experience for all participants.
