Fun Facts


- About 1 in 2 million American Lobsters have blue shells.

Fun Facts


- Horseshoe crabs are older than dinosaurs - they have been around for 450 million years!

Fun Facts


- Moon snails drill perfect circular holes through the shells of their prey clams and other mollusks.


- Sea stars have tiny **tube feet** on the bottom of their arms which help them move and grip.
